**STATEMENT ON QUARTERLY REVIEW OF THE TRENDS IN RECEIPTS AND
EXPENDITURE IN RELATION TO THE BUDGET AT THE END OF
THIRD QUARTER OF FINANCIAL YEAR 2009-10**

Macroeconomic backdrop

As per the data on the Gross Domestic Product (GDP) at constant prices, released by the Central Statistical Organisation, the economy grew by 6.1 per cent and 7.9 per cent in the first and second quarters of 2009-10 respectively. During the third quarter of 2009-10, the economy grew by 6.0 per cent compared to 6.2 per cent during the same quarter last year. For the full year 2009-10, the economy is estimated to have grown by 7.2 per cent compared to 6.7 per cent in 2008-09, indicating recovery from deceleration in growth.

Within the overall GDP, during the third quarter of 2009-10, the industrial sector, services sector and agriculture sector recorded growth of 11.6 per cent, 6.3 per cent and (-)2.8 per cent respectively, compared to 2.1 per cent, 11.4 per cent and (-)1.4 per cent respectively during the third quarter of last year. While the negative growth in agriculture sector during the third quarter of 2009-10 was due to the deficient south west monsoon, the slowdown in growth in service sector was the result of the deceleration in 'community, social and personal services', following their significant expansion (base effect) in the same period of 2008-09.

Year-on-year inflation based on the Wholesale Price Index, in the third quarter of 2009-10, was 4.99 per cent compared to 8.56 per cent during the corresponding period of 2008-09. The average inflation during April-December 2009 was 1.80 per cent as against 10.20 per cent for the corresponding period of 2008-09.

The first advanced estimates of agriculture production released by the Ministry of Agriculture on December 16, 2009 placed the total kharif food grains production at 98.83 million tonnes during 2009-10. This was subsequently revised to 99.85 million tonnes in the second advance estimates released on February 12, 2010. The total food grains production, during 2009-10, as per the second advance estimates was 216.85 million tonnes compared to 234.47 million tonnes (final estimates) during 2008-09. The decline in food grains production in 2009-10 has been attributed to the deficiency in south west monsoon. The south west monsoon deficiency in 2009 was estimated to be about 23 per cent compared to the Long Period Average.

During 2009-10 (April-December), exports were valued at US \$ 117.6 billion (based on customs data), which was 20.3 per cent lower than the level of US \$ 147.6 billion in 2008-09 (April-December). During April-December 2009, imports were valued at US \$ 193.8 billion, which was 23.6 per cent lower than the level of US \$ 253.8 billion in 2008-09 (April-December). The POL imports during the same period declined by 29.8 per cent mainly due to falling international oil prices.

The trade deficit (based on data from Reserve Bank of India) during April-December 2009 decreased to US\$ 89.5 billion compared to US\$ 98.4 billion during the same period last year, primarily on account of lower oil and non oil imports. Net invisibles declined from US\$ 70.9 billion in 2008-09 (April-December) to US\$ 59.2 billion during 2009-10 (April-December), mainly due to lower receipts under almost all components of services coupled with lower investment income receipts. However, private transfer receipts, comprising mainly remittances from Indians working overseas, increased in April-December 2009. In total, the current account deficit widened to US\$ 30.3 billion in the first three quarters of 2009-10, as against US\$ 27.5 billion during the corresponding period in 2008-09.

Net capital flows at US\$ 43.2 billion in April-December 2009 was much higher as compared with US\$ 5.8 billion in April-December 2008. This was mainly due to larger inflows under FDI, portfolio investments and NRI deposits during April-December 2009.

India's foreign exchange reserves increased from US\$ 252.0 billion at end March 2009 to US\$ 283.5 billion at end December 2009, which is explained by a combination of positive valuation effect, higher inflows under FDI and portfolio investments and outflow due to the current account deficit. The weakening of US dollar in the international market and surge in capital flows led to appreciation in the value of rupee against US dollar. Based on average monthly exchange rate of rupee, the Indian rupee appreciated by 9.9 per cent from Rs 51.23 per US dollar in March 2009 to Rs 46.63 per US dollar in December 2009.

Review of trends in receipts and expenditure during April-December, 2009

The global financial crisis in the second half of 2008-09 shifted the focus of fiscal policy, across the world, to providing growth stimulus. India, like other countries of the world, was also facing difficult economic situation. The Government adopted the path of increasing the public expenditure, even with lower revenue receipts, in order to stimulate the economy by creating demand to maintain the high growth trajectory. Accordingly, the Government announced a series of fiscal stimulus packages in quick succession. These measures were aimed to spur growth and restore revenue buoyancy and provide the required fiscal space to revert to the path of fiscal consolidation. The impact of these measures has started showing results with economy recording growth of 6.0 per cent in the 3rd Quarter of 2009-10. This is better than the growth recorded in the corresponding period of financial year 2008-09 and indicates sign of recovery in the Indian economy while the economies around the world still facing difficulties to bounce back.

The fiscal deficit for the year 2009-10 was estimated at 6.8 per cent of GDP in BE 2009-10, which was estimated to reduce to 6.7 per cent of GDP in RE 2009-10. For the review of performance, figures of BE 2009-10 have been taken into account. The revenue deficit is estimated at 4.8 per cent of GDP in the year 2009-10. Overall fiscal performance in the 3rd Quarter with fiscal deficit and revenue deficit at 77.3 per cent and 88.9 percent of BE 2009-10 respectively, is in line with the Budget Estimates 2009-10. For the trend analysis purpose, the Budget Estimates presented in July, 2009 have been taken as base number since these estimates override the estimates presented in Interim Budget 2009-10.

Summarised position on trends in receipts and expenditure at the end of third quarter of year 2009-10 (April-December, 2009) is given below in table 1. The figures therein are unaudited and may undergo revision subsequent to audit. The receipts and recoveries, wherever directly linked to expenditure, have been netted out.

RECEIPTS

Revenue receipts

The revenue receipts at ₹3,89,271 crore during April-December, 2009 are 63.3 per cent of B.E. 2009-10 reflecting a growth of 3.6 per cent over corresponding period in 2008-09.

Gross tax revenue collection has declined from ₹4,26,794.68 crore at the end of December, 2008 to ₹4,16,094.22 crore in the third quarter of 2009-10 reflecting a decline of 2.6 per cent. The gross tax revenue in BE 2009-10 was estimated at 5.9 per cent over 2008-09. The net tax revenue receipt for Central Government after assignment to States during April-December, 2009 has decreased from ₹ 3,09,926.57 crore in 2008-09 to ₹3,07,591.28 crore during 2009-10. This accounts for 64.9 per cent of BE 2009-10. Five years moving average of this component during April-December, 2009 as percentage of BE is 65.5 per cent. The non tax revenue receipt during April-December, 2009 is ₹81,680.45 crore amounting to 58.2 per cent of B.E. 2009-10 in comparison to ₹66,010.07 crore during the same period in the previous year.

GROSS TAX REVENUE

Gross tax to GDP ratio was estimated at 10.9 per cent in BE 2009-10 which is similar to the provisional accounts of 2008-09. In absolute terms gross tax revenue in BE 2009-10 was estimated at ₹6,41,079 crore reflecting growth of 5.9 per cent over provisional gross tax receipts during 2008-09. The collection during

April-December, 2009 is at ₹4,16,094.22 crore reflecting a decline of 2.5 per cent over corresponding period receipts of previous financial year (₹4,26,794.68 crore). This decline is primarily on account of steep decline in indirect tax components, namely, Customs and Union Excise Duties by 29.2 per cent and 18.2 per cent respectively. The shortfall in indirect tax collection has been compensated with higher collection in direct tax components during April-December, 2009. Trends in quarterly growth in Gross Tax Revenue for 2008-09 and 2009-10 are indicated in chart 1 below:





The significant shift which took place during 2007-08 wherein the direct tax collection for the first time surpassed the indirect tax collection has maintained the same trend during the third quarter of 2009-10. This reinforces the shift in the taxation system towards a more progressive and equitable structure.

DIRECT TAXES

The gross direct tax collection has increased by 13.2 per cent to a sum of ₹2,55,454 crore for April-December, 2009 over April-December, 2008 (₹2,25,694 crore). Corporation tax continues to be the largest component of total taxes. Corporation tax collection during April-December, 2009 is ₹ 1,68,299 crore with growth of 16.85 per cent over collections during the same period in 2008-09. This amounts to 66 per cent of B.E.2009-10. Trends in quarterly growth in collection of Corporation Tax for 2009-10 are indicated in chart 2 below:



Taxes on income other than Corporation tax were estimated at ₹1,06,800 crore reflecting growth of 0.7 per cent over receipts during 2008-09. Actual collections of ₹79,484 crore at the end of the third quarter reflect a growth of 12.2 per cent over collections during corresponding period in the previous financial year.

Trends in quarterly growth in collection of Taxes on income other than Corporation tax for 2008-09 and 2009-10 are indicated in chart 3 below:




INDIRECT TAXES

The gross indirect tax collection during April-December, 2009 is ₹1,60,640 crore reflecting a decline of 20 per cent over collection during April-December, 2008. The B.E. 2009-10 was estimated at ₹2,71,504 crore reflecting a decline of 15.95 per cent over 2008-09.

Union Excise Duty collection has decreased from ₹77,108 crore during April-December, 2008 to ₹63,046 crore during April-December, 2009. The decline of 18.2 per cent is largely on account of change in mean CENVAT rate from 14 per cent to 8 per cent in 2009-10. Though the impact of change in duty rate is of the order of (-) 43 per cent, the decline in excise duty receipts by 18.2 per cent is a positive trend. Trends in quarterly growth in collection of Excise Duty for 2008-09 and 2009-10 are indicated in chart 4 below:

The performance on customs collection at the end of third quarter of 2009-10 also shows a declining trend. For this component, BE 2009-10 was estimated at ₹ 98,000 crore reflecting a decline of 1.9 per cent over actuals of 2008-09. This decline was estimated on account of continuing fall in imports due to the prevailing economic slow down. Receipts under this component have decline by 29.1 per cent at the end of third quarter of 2009-10 over the corresponding period in 2008-09. The collection during April-December, 2009 is 60 per cent of BE 2009-10.


Trends in quarterly growth in collection of Custom Duty for 2008-09 and 2009-10 are indicated in chart 5 below:

Service tax in BE 2009-10 is estimated at ₹65,000 crore reflecting a growth of 6.7 per cent over receipts in 2008-09. At the end of third quarter of the current fiscal, this component is showing a decline of 6.0 per cent over the corresponding period of 2008-09. During this period, the effective impact of change in Service Tax rate is (-) 16.7 per cent whereas the decline in service tax receipt is only of the order of 6.0 per cent. This is a positive trend. Trends in quarterly growth in collection of Service Tax for 2008-09 and 2009-10 are indicated in chart 6 below:

NON TAX REVENUE

Non tax revenue receipts during April-December 2009 is ₹ 81,680.45 crore amounting to 58.2 per cent of B.E.2009-10 showing a growth of 23.7 per cent over receipts during corresponding period of previous financial year.

EXPENDITURE

Total expenditure for 2009-10 is estimated at ₹10,20,838 crore which is 17.4 per cent of GDP, up by 15.5 per cent over actual expenditure of ₹8,83,956 crore in 2008-09. The expenditure, during April-December 2009, at ₹7,07,540 crore amounts to 69.3 per cent of B.E.2009-10 against five year moving average of 70.0 per cent. Total expenditure at the end of third quarter of 2009-10 reflects a growth of 18.47 per cent in expenditure over ₹5,97,216 crore during the same period in the previous financial year.

Revenue expenditure during April-December 2009 has gone up from ₹5,49,767 crore in 2008-09 to ₹6,40,525 crore in 2009-10 reflecting a growth of 16.5 per cent and amounting to 71.4 per cent of the estimated revenue expenditure during 2009-10. Capital expenditure during April-December, 2009 is ₹67,015 crore as against ₹47,449 crore during the same period in 2008. Capital expenditure at the end of third quarter 2009-10 is 54.2 per cent of the estimated capital expenditure during 2009-10. Trends in expenditure as percentage of B.E. as well as ratio of GDP at the end of third quarter 2009-10 are shown in table 4 :

Plan Expenditure

Plan Expenditure in BE 2009-10 at ₹3,25,149 crore reflects a growth of 18 per cent over the provisional actuals of 2008-09. (This comes to 33.6 per cent over BE 2008-09). Plan expenditure of ₹2,10,159 crore during April-December, 2009 shows a growth of 23 per cent over the corresponding period during 2008. Plan Expenditure during the period from April-December, 2009 is 3.41 per cent of GDP as against 3.06 per cent in the same period of the previous year.

Trends in plan expenditure as percentage of GDP and as percentage of B.E. at the end of third quarter of respective financial years are shown in table 5 below:

Non Plan Expenditure

Non-plan expenditure was estimated in BE 2009-10 at ₹6,95,689 crore and constitutes 68.1 per cent of total estimated expenditure during 2009-10. This reflects growth of 14.3 per cent over the non plan expenditure in 2008-09. The expenditure during April-December, 2009 is at ₹4,97,381 crore showing a growth of 16.64 per cent over expenditure of ₹4,26,419 crore during the same period in the previous financial year. Non-plan expenditure at the end of third quarter is 71.5 per cent of the estimated expenditure

during 2009-10 as against five years moving average of 72.5 per cent. The outgo on food subsidy has increased from ₹ 33,915 crore to ₹47,141 crore. Various subsidies on fertiliser have decreased from ₹67,533 crore in 2008-09 to ₹47,779 crore in 2009-10 at the end of third quarter. Another non discretionary item namely pension has also shown higher outgo of ₹37,465 crore during April-December, 2009 showing a growth of 74.4 per cent over the same period of previous year. Expenditure of ₹3,92,896 crore on interest payments, defence services, pensions, major subsidies and grants and loans to States taken together continue to share high proportion of non-plan expenditure during April-December, 2009. Trends in non-plan expenditure as percentage of GDP and as percentage of B.E. at the end of third quarter of respective financial years are shown in table 6 below:

Resources transferred to States/UTs

Against the B.E. 2009-10 of ₹ 3,13,751 crore for transfers to States/UTs, the actual transfer during the period from April-December, 2009 is ₹2,09,497 crore. This shows a growth of 3.9 per cent over ₹2,01,581 crore transferred during the corresponding period in the previous financial year. Of this, ₹2,07,536 crore have been transferred to State Governments and ₹1,961 crore have been transferred to UT Governments.

Deficit

Fiscal deficit for the year 2009-10 is estimated in BE at ₹4,00,996 crore amounting to 6.8 per cent of GDP. For the period up to December, 2009 fiscal deficit is ₹ 3,09,980 crore which is 77.3 per cent of B.E.2009-10. Fiscal deficit was ₹2,18,262 crore during the corresponding period in the previous financial year amounting to 163.8 per cent of estimated deficit in 2008-09. Performance on fiscal deficit as percentage of BE at the end of third quarter of 2009-10 compares well with five years moving average of 83.3 per cent.

Revenue deficit for 2009-10 is estimated at ₹2,82,735 crore amounting to 4.8 per cent of GDP. During the period April-December, 2009 revenue deficit is ₹2,51,254 crore amounting to 88.9 per cent of B.E. 2009-10. Revenue deficit during April- December, 2008 was ₹1,73,830 crore constituting 315 per cent of B.E. 2008-09 and five years moving average of revenue deficit at the end of third quarter as percentage of BE is 123 per cent.

Revenue receipts for government are back loaded whereas the budgeted expenditure for the year needs to be spread uniformly during the financial year to ensure adequate availability of resources for execution of budgeted schemes. This results in imbalance in revenue account in the earlier part of the financial year resulting in higher revenue deficit.

Trends in deficit as percentage of GDP and as percentage of B.E. at the end of third quarter of respective financial years are shown in table 7 below:

Financing of deficit

Fiscal deficit of ₹3,09,980 crore during April-December 2009 was financed by raising internal debt (net) of ₹3,60,341 crore and external assistance of ₹6,212 crore. Gross and net market borrowings (including 364-day Treasury Bills) during April-December, 2009 amounted to ₹4,37,369 crore and ₹3,71,431 crore, respectively, accounting for 97 per cent and 93 per cent of the estimated market borrowings for the year. During the corresponding period of the previous financial year, gross and net borrowings accounted for 128 per cent and 116 per cent, respectively. The weighted average maturity of dated securities issued at the end of third quarter of the fiscal year 2009-10 at 11.15 years was lower than 14.60 years during the corresponding period of the previous year. The weighted average yield of dated securities issued during the same period decreased to 7.21 per cent from 8.38 per cent. Details of financing of deficit at the end of third quarter in 2009-10 and 2008-09 are shown below:

Cash Management

The year commenced with surplus cash balance of ₹16,319 crore including investment surplus of ₹16,219 crore. At the end of the third quarter of 2009-10, the government increased its investment through RBI to ₹50,000 crore. The cash balance stood at ₹42,146 crore at the end of third quarter of 2009-10.

Market Stabilisation Scheme

The accumulation under Market Stabilization Scheme at the end of March 2009 (Provisional) was ₹88,860 crore. Government repaid ₹70,000 crore (net) under this scheme during the year up to December 2009. Net accretion under the scheme is as detailed in table 8 below :

During April-December 2009, net collection under Small Savings has increased from ₹(-)11,206 crore in 2008-09 to ₹25,097 crore.

Conclusion

Subsequent to the global meltdown, there was a compelling need to adjust the fiscal policy to take care of exceptional circumstances. Interventions of the Government through various fiscal and administrative measures started showing results. However, the Government calibrated its exit policy with due caution without putting at risk the revival process as well as without indulging in fiscal profligacy.

The financial performance till the end of third quarter is broadly in line with the Budget Estimates 2009-10. The fiscal deficit is at 77.3 per cent of BE 2009-10 which is lower than the five years moving average of 83.3 per cent of BE of these years Similarly, revenue deficit at 88.9 per cent of BE is much lower than the five years moving average of 123 per cent.
